E-Biking From Washington Sailing Marina to National Harbor and Fort Foote

DISTANCE: +/- 21 MILES

Bike into history with a visit to Point Jones Lighthouse and Fort Foote at the Potomac River.

ROUTE

Washington Sailing Marina, Marina Drive, Alexandria From the marina, follow the Mount Vernon Trail to the oldest inland lighthouse. Make sure to use biking directions in Google Maps.

Jones Point Lighthouse, Alexandria From the lighthouse, the trail leads to Maryland over the Woodrow Wilson Bridge with great views of the area.

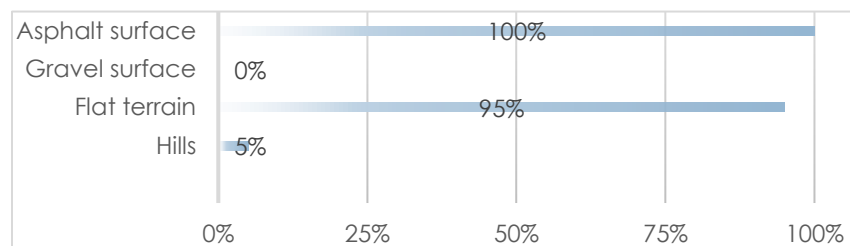
The Capital Wheel With more than 1.6 million LED lights, the wheel soars 180 feet above the Potomac River.

Fort Foote Park, Fort Foote Road, Fort Washington, MD The fort was constructed in 1863 atop Rozier's Bluff to strengthen the fortifications that encircled Washington DC.

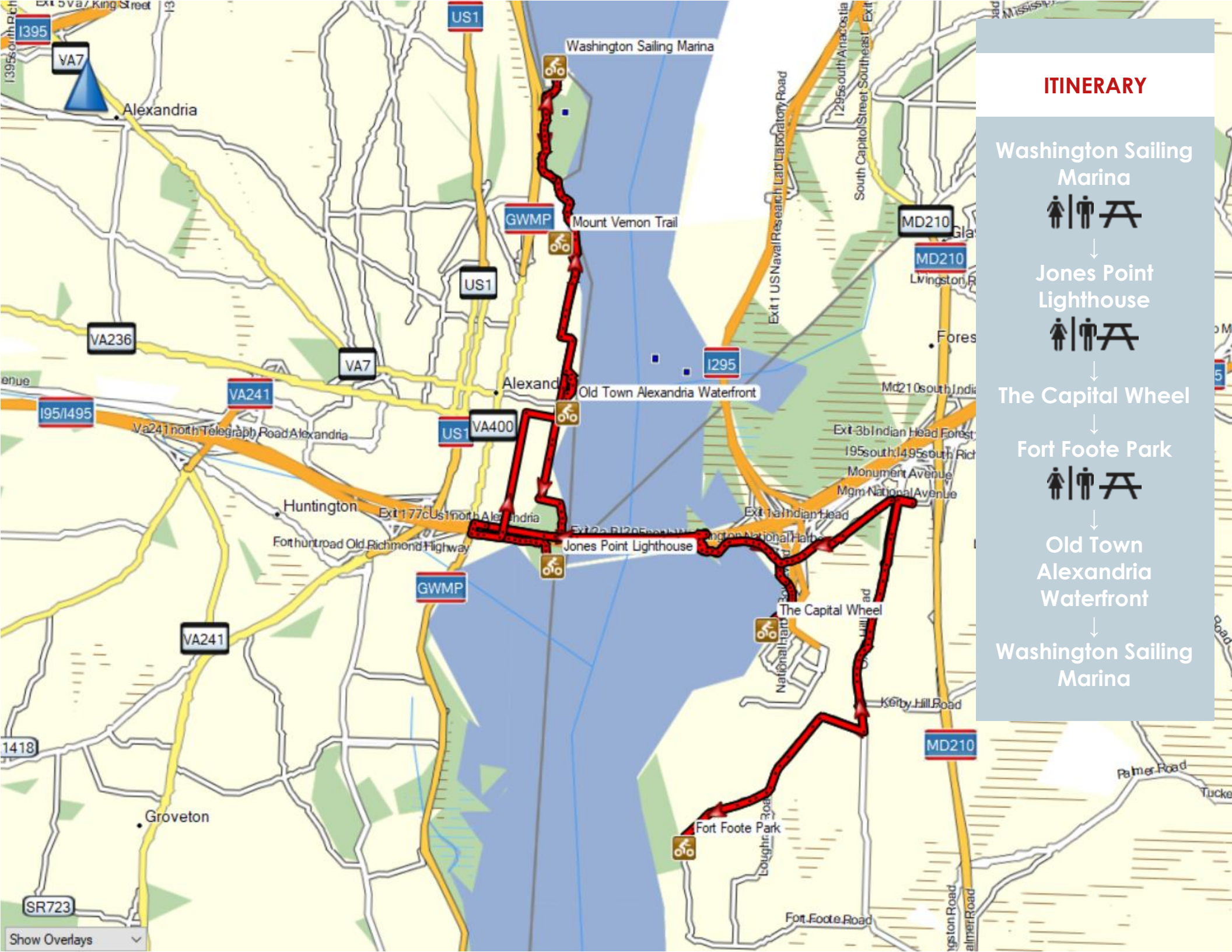
Old Town Alexandria Waterfront, Prince Street, Alexandria Follow directions to the Waterfront.
